A Note from HON's CEO

For 30 years, HON has championed a Nashville made stronger by volunteers.

Hands On Nashville supports hundreds of nonprofits, schools, and civic agencies by recruiting volunteers, connecting them to needs, and helping organizations reimagine and amplify volunteer power. The agency also provides critical volunteer leadership in the aftermath of disaster.

HON was founded in 1991 by Hal Cato. At the time, Cato volunteered for Meals on Wheels during his lunch breaks. He had such a rewarding experience that he started bringing friends along to deliver meals with him. Soon, those friends began developing volunteer opportunities with other nonprofits.

As his passion for service grew, Cato became aware of the work that a group in Atlanta was doing. This group would later form the HandsOn Network (now part of the Points of Light Institute). After visiting with the folks in Atlanta, Cato and his friends said, "Let's do this in Nashville, too." And the idea was born to create an organization that makes it easy for people to find meaningful volunteer opportunities in the Nashville area.

Hands On Nashville began as a true grassroots effort. In its first year of operation, there were no paid staff or budget, and Cato provided office space in his home. The group set a goal to recruit 250 volunteers, and they created fliers listing volunteer opportunities and left them in people's mailboxes. Nearly 30 years later, HON is a vibrant and growing connector where individuals, nonprofits, and businesses can engage in meaningful service that builds stronger neighborhoods and communities.

2020 was a difficult year for Nashville. Like the rest of the world, the nonprofit community reeled from the impacts of COVID-19. Local organizations stayed busy adapting their ongoing programs, while also meeting the critical needs that emerged from the pandemic and the tornado, as well as the Christmas Day bombing on 2nd Avenue.

Volunteers were crucial to helping HON's community partners meet the needs of Nashvillians. Volunteers masked up and helped with the organization and distribution of essential items, food distribution, tree planting, tech support for virtual learners, park restoration, swim lessons, and much more. Volunteers connected with creative ways to support their neighbors from home through an unprecedented number of virtual and remote projects, helping local agencies with administrative tasks, data entry, writing cards and letters to seniors, and more.

The Community Partner Program team boosted volunteer managers' efforts.

During a year when operations seemed anything but normal, HON's Community Partner Program team strived to engage and support nonprofits and their volunteer managers. At top of mind was managing volunteers in times of change, crisis, and COVID-19.

In 2020, HON made it easier for partners to benefit from its services by providing online volunteer engagement technology training and asking corporate supporters to fund partnership fees for organizations that align with their community priorities.

Similarly, after the Volunteer Administrators Network (VAN), convened by HON, went virtual during the pandemic, dues that had been collected to provide lunch during the meetings were no longer required. Membership increased by nearly 50%.

When COVID-19 hit communities across the country, businesses paused on sending their employees to conferences and most types of in-person volunteer events. But many companies still wanted a way for their employees to give back. The HON team worked with those companies to come up with custom and creative at-home projects employees could work on to support their neighbors in need.

Employee teams created more than 5,000 care packages for teachers, students, veterans, individuals experiencing homelessness, and seniors. Those at-home projects allowed many to engage their families in their volunteer activities.

In a year when the whole world went online to conduct much of its business, skills-based volunteers were busy!

GeekCause engaged volunteers to help implement grants that funded new technology and software allowing nonprofit teams to work from home. Volunteers also completed a variety of collaborative projects with nonprofits: They refined data storage and management practices, developed apps, updated branding suites, and more for a combined project value of \$170,000. HON's GeekCause team also provided support for Hack for the Community, a the HCA Healthcare/Nashville Technology Council hackathon in which 200 volunteers from 30 businesses knocked out quick-turn tech projects for 14 nonprofits.

AmeriCorps members boosted program power at 7 Nashville nonprofits.

In 2019-2020, 20 AmeriCorps members served more than 30,000 hours building capacity for seven nonprofits in six key areas, including processes, communications, program development, evaluation, community collaboration, and volunteer management. On average, programs increased capacity in 3.7 focus areas and experienced a 14% increase in overall capacity. Not surprisingly, members contributed more capacity to smaller organizations where they could affect a greater portion of the programming.

Additionally, AmeriCorps members played a critical role in volunteer leadership in the aftermath of the March 3 tornado, and committed more than 1,400 hours to tornado response efforts.













Hearts for service were celebrated virtually to keep the community safe.

The Mary Catherine Strobel Volunteer Awards are Middle Tennessee's largest annual celebration of volunteerism. The event, held in partnership with the Strobel family, features six award categories that honor volunteers who give their time and talents to improve the community.

Nominees, finalists, and recipients are typically celebrated at a luncheon attended by 600-plus guests. This year's celebration was held entirely online due to COVID-19 precautions. Each recipient was honored in a video about his or her service, and HON's Community Relations Coordinator delivered the awards to each recipient's home for a safe and socially distant handoff.

ABOUT MARY CATHERINE STROBEL

Mary Catherine Schweiss Strobel is best remembered and honored in Middle Tennessee for her tireless, joyful commitment to those in need.

She also made Nashville history. In 1937, she married Martin George Strobel, an employee of the Nashville Fire Department. Ten years later, Martin died of a heart attack. Knowing that Mary Catherine now faced providing for her four young children and two elderly aunts alone, Chief Henry Demonbruen broke precedent and offered her a job in the Fire Marshal's office. She thus became the first female employee of the Nashville Fire Department, and the only one for the next 29 years.

Volunteers powered Nashville's disaster response during a year of multiple crises.

Nashville's Office of Emergency Management relies on Hands On Nashville to activate and manage volunteers in the aftermath of disaster. 2020 brought three distinct but overlapping disasters — a tornado, COVID-19, and an act of terrorism. Volunteers proved critical to Nashville's disaster response, and they provided crucial manpower to agencies on the ground meeting the needs of survivors.

Recognizing the need for consistent disaster-planning and -response leadership, Hands On Nashville took the lead in reconvening the disbanded Nashville-area chapter of Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD). Twenty organizations so far have joined VOAD to collaborate and strengthen the community's ability to respond quickly to future disasters.

Thousands raised their hands to help clean up after the deadly March 3 tornado.

HON connected volunteers to opportunities to help with cleanup, canvassing, food and item distribution, roof tarping, and more in the aftermath of the deadly and devastating storms.

HON used its communications platforms to let volunteers know which areas of town were safe to operate in, to identify and meet urgent needs, and to spread the word about where to take donations. HON coordinated volunteer transportation into affected neighborhoods and connected people who wanted to share food with service providers on the ground, resulting in thousands of meals served to first responders and those affected by the tornado. Additionally, HON offered its expertise to help dozens of grassroots and faith-based organizations create volunteer management and disaster assistance protocols that increased their capacity to serve the community effectively.

From tests to vaccinations, volunteers have boosted COVID-19 response efforts.

When COVID-19 came to Middle Tennessee, HON quickly reduced volunteer group sizes and worked with its nonprofit partners to ensure they had access to hand sanitizer and PPE.

Volunteers supported the city's three drive-thru testing centers, the COVID-19 call center, and the MasksNOW TN mask-making initiative, which served around 30 area organizations. Volunteers helped sort and distribute food and essential items for a variety of food pantries and distribution programs, and offered tech support to virtual learners for Metro Nashville Public Schools.

In December, the health department's first vaccine clinic opened, and volunteers continue to support the healthcare workers making it possible for hundreds of people to receive their life-saving vaccines each day.

A shocking man-made disaster brought out still more volunteers to help.

The blast on Christmas morning was puzzling at first, then surreal as details came out about the RV and the man suspected of blowing it and himself up on Second Avenue.

Even before Nashvillians had a clear picture of what had happened, they were already asking: *How can I help?* Volunteers and AmeriCorps members took turns at the Community Resource Center, organizing and packaging donations of food and essential items for first responders and survivors, and they spent time near the blast site offering support to survivors moving their belongings out of the damaged buildings.


